

The Year in Review: Gains and Losses

The Michigan Supreme Court Historical Society had a busy and productive year in 2004.

We undertook our largest publishing project yet and produced an updated volume of the *Index to Special Sessions*. The book contains a complete index to all of the special sessions held in the Michigan Supreme Court since 1837 and includes transcripts of all of the special sessions since 1988.

While the publication of the Index is perhaps our most notable achievement of 2004, the Historical Society also continued to pursue its educational goals with several smaller projects. We created and made available to teachers, students, and the public a "Hunt and Find" quiz about the justices of the Michigan Supreme Court. The quiz challenges readers to review the biographies found in the *Michigan Supreme Court Historical Reference Guide* and discover interesting facts about the lives of our former justices. We also completed and made available online a "Homes of the Michigan Supreme Court" page; the article tells the interesting history of the many meeting places of the Court since its creation in 1805.

In April, we again hosted our Annual Membership Luncheon at the Detroit Athletic Club. Members and their guests were treated to a vignette by author David G. Chardavoyne about the trial and execution of Stephen G. Simmons - the last man executed under Michigan law.

In May, we assisted the Court in celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the landmark U.S. Supreme Court Case

Brown v. Board of Education. The program featured welcoming and introductory remarks by Chief Justice Maura D. Corrigan and remarks by Mr. Ernest Green, one of the "Little Rock Nine".

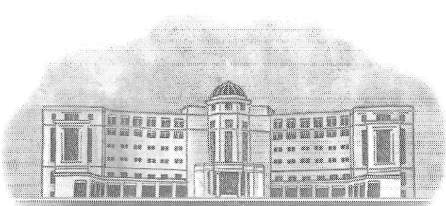
In 2004, we also welcomed two new members of the Board of Directors, Mr. Leonard D. Givens and Mr. Carl W. Herstein.

The 2004 Coleman Intern, Heather Weeks, spent the first part of her internship updating the indexes which were published in the book and scanning and editing transcripts of special sessions. She spent the summer at the Library of Michigan and the State Archives creating an annotated bibliography of the research resources available there to everyone interested in the history of the Court.

In cooperation with Western Michigan University, the Society established the Big Four Writing and Research Fellowship. The fellowship was designed to foster academic research on the history of the Supreme Court of Michigan and dissemination of such research. During the 2003-2004 academic year, Coreen Derifield researched and wrote a paper entitled "Prohibited From Using Peaceful Measures: The Michigan Supreme Court and Labor Injunctions in Detroit, 1897-1907."

The paper focuses on several turn-of-the-century rulings against labor unions. In the cases, the Michigan Supreme Court sanctioned the use of injunctions to prohibit boycotts and picketing, two of labor's most effective weapons in disputes. The decisions coincided

with the Detroit Employers' Association's drive to make Detroit an "open shop" town. The paper argues that the Michigan Supreme Court rulings on injunctions gave Detroit employers an important tool they could use against striking labor unions and that the injunctions greatly affected the ability of a union to successfully conduct a strike. The paper analyzes the important role of the Michigan Supreme Court in Detroit's early twentieth-century labor movement.

Despite our many achievements in the past year, our year ended with several great losses. Late in October, the Historical Society lost its founder and honorary chair, former Chief Justice Dorothy Comstock Riley, my wife and companion for over 41 years. Just last year in a speech I made before the Court, I commented:

It is noteworthy that we still enjoy the inspiration and guidance of our Honorary Chair and your former colleague, Chief Justice Dorothy Comstock Riley, who attends all of our board meetings and is here today. For fifteen years she has truly been "the wind beneath our wings" – sometimes a hurricane force of motivation, but always a gentle breeze setting and steadying our course.

Her inspiration and wisdom will be missed, but we hope to continue to apply her vision through the diligent work of the Society.

Late in December, the Historical Society experienced another great loss – the death of former board member and oral historian Roger F. Lane. Perhaps more than any

other individual who has served on our Board of Directors, Roger made great contributions to the preservation of the history of the Court. An original member of the Board of Directors, he proposed the oral history project, volunteered countless hours of his time to research the background and written opinions of the former justices to adequately prepare for the interviews, and was solely responsible for interviewing, recording, and overseeing the transcription of twelve oral histories of former justices.

This January, we lost yet another of our long-time directors and supporters, Judge R. Stuart Hoffius. The judge had been a member of the Historical Society Board of Directors since 1992 and over the past 12 years had served on countless committees and worked on countless projects. His presence on our board will be greatly missed.

In recent remarks at the Ave Maria School of Law in Ann Arbor, U.S. Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia stated that "The most important Court in the life of any individual is his or her state supreme court." We at the Historical Society truly believe this to be true and will continue our work to educate Michigan citizens about the importance of the Michigan judicial system, the importance of the Michigan Supreme Court, and the wonderful history of that great institution.

Thank you all for your continuing support of our work. And special thanks for your kind words and heartfelt sympathies in the past months.

A Message from the Executive Director

Another exciting year is in store for 2005. It promises to be year of changes and new projects, but also to be a year of more of the same. We will continue our efforts to protect and preserve the history of the Michigan Supreme Court by inventorying and restoring the Court's priceless collection of portraits, by encouraging the archivation of documents and records of the Court, and by conducting research and producing publications about the history of the Court.

Special Sessions and Events

We are looking forward to cooperating with the Court on several projects and special sessions in the coming year. On March 8, the Michigan Supreme Court and the Historical Society will host a special session to acknowledge the State Bar's permanent loan of the "Big Four" painting to the Court. The session will be held in the courtroom on the sixth floor of the Hall of Justice and will feature remarks about the big four justices and the reorganization that took place during their time on the Court.

On April 28, the Historical Society will once again host the Annual Membership Luncheon at the Detroit Athletic Club. The Luncheon will feature a vignette about John D. Voelker by Michigan Supreme Court Commissioner Fred

Baker, Jr. We sincerely hope you are able to attend and look forward to seeing each of you.

2005 marks the 200th Anniversary of the creation of the Michigan Territorial Supreme Court. In cooperation with the Court, the Historical Society is developing a program to mark the occasion. More information about the time, place, and subject of the program will follow in an upcoming newsletter.

She is focusing her research on Judge Augustus Woodward, the establishment of the Territorial Court, and cases that may have come before the Court in 1805. Carly will also be continuing to work on the bibliography project that was started by the 2004 Coleman Intern. We hope to complete a bibliography of resources about the history of the Court available at the Burton Historical Collection, the Bentley Historical Library, and the University of Michigan Library by the end of the summer.

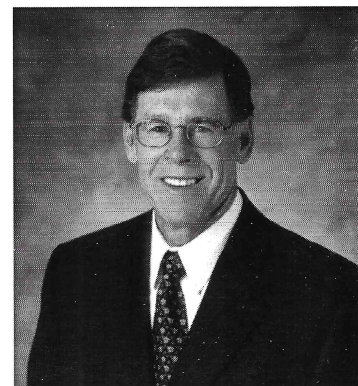
Big Four Writing and Research Project

Coreen Derifield, the Big Four Writing and Research Fellow at Western Michigan University, is continuing her research. She plans to finish her thesis, titled "The Rights of Property: The Michigan Supreme Court and Labor Injunctions, 1895-1945" by fall. The thesis will analyze seven different Michigan Supreme Court cases across these fifty years.

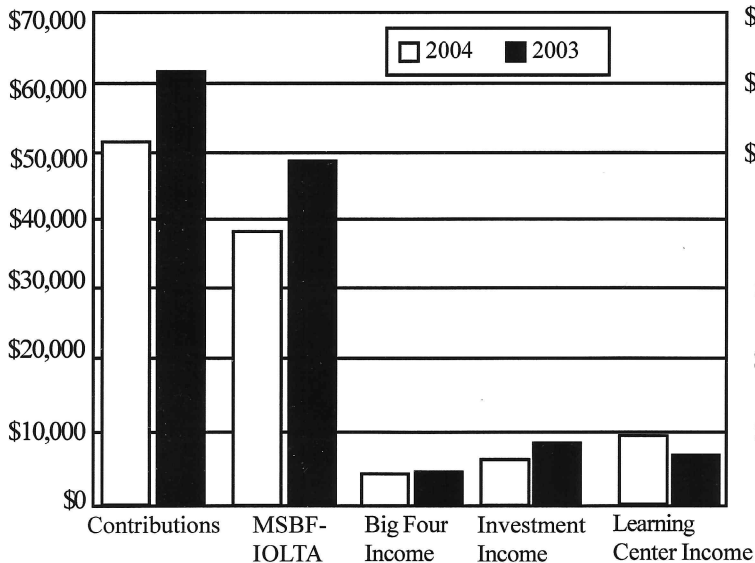

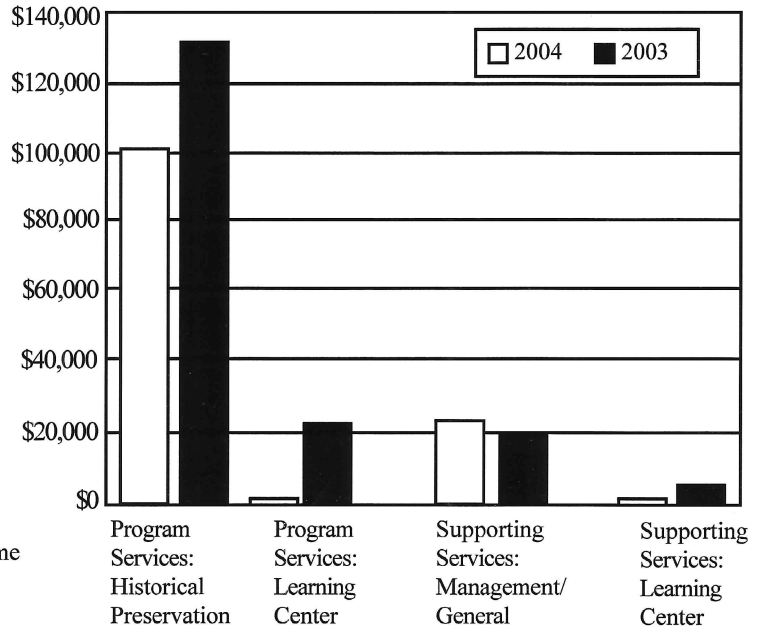
