If you've ever visited our website, you already know that the Historical Society has an enormous amount of information online and available to the public. Unfortunately, in the past, the sheer volume of the information has made it difficult to find specific information quickly and efficiently.

With this challenge in mind, the Historical Society has been working with the Grand Rapids Community Media Center, a nonprofit organization specializing in web design and hosting for nonprofits, to give the site a new look and feel.

The new design, which went "live" in March, features several new elements.

First and foremost, the site is now searchable. This alone will help make the site easier to use, and will save researchers a great deal of time and energy.

Secondly, the menu has been reorganized. It is now conveniently divided into three main menus: Members,

significant cases project, will be gathering copyright releases for the images, and will be assisting me in some administrative tasks.


VERDICT OF HISTORY LESSON PLANS A HIT




